After nearly 7 years serving the older adults in Will County as the Chief Executive Officer of Senior Services, Brianne Hetman, is leaving the organization in late September.

This transition is part of the next chapter for Hetman, as she has been working in social services for nearly 25 years all across the region. She joined Senior Services of Will County in 2018 and has been a part of the organization's many initiatives in the community, including expansion of services for caregivers and relatives raising children and, the development of the Ovation Center in Romeoville.

"It has been an honor to serve as the Chief Executive Officer at Senior Services. This community is focused on development and supporting initiatives to keep progress moving for our residents. Focusing not only on current needs, but what our future looks like. This is critical for older adults and their families." Hetman said.

Hetman's next move is to the Child Network, a children's advocacy center and court appointed special advocates agency, dedicated to improving the response to child sexual and physical abuse in Kankakee and Iroquois Counties. She will serve as the agency's Executive Director.

Senior Services of Will County's Board President Laura Daley said, Hetman has been able to do extraordinary things as the organization's leader. "Brianne has been a pleasure to work alongside and ensure the needs of older adults are met across the County." She went on to say the Board is looking forward to identifying the next future leader.
